


CHILDREN'S RIGHTS

► "Know Your Rights": Your Rights as a Child or Young Person



Do you want information on what rights and entitlements children have in Ireland? Do you need information on where to go when those rights and entitlements are not respected? The Children's Rights Alliance has produced a guide on children's rights and entitlements in plain language. "Know Your Rights" is a guide for children and young people that explains their rights in Ireland. Written in plain language, it lists all children's rights and other entitlements, including where to get help when these rights are not respected.



► Family Carers Ireland : The State of Caring Report 2024



Family Carers Ireland unveiled its 'State of Caring 2024' Survey, revealing an alarming and deteriorating situation for family carers across the country. The extensive survey, with responses from 2,127 family carers, highlights the crushing impact of systemic neglect, financial strain and a deepening housing crisis.

Key findings include: 76% of carers report severe or moderate loneliness.

- **74%** of family carers surveyed said that the people they support do not receive sufficient formal support.
- **72%** have never received respite.
- **69%** find it difficult to make ends meet (with 29% of those struggling financially cutting back on essentials such as food and heat).
- **49%** have paid privately for products or services that should be publicly provided to support their caring role.
- **34**% said their accommodation is not suitable to meet the needs of the person they care for
- **23%** missed at least one mortgage or rent payment over the past year, with 17% of mortgage holders missing a payment.

Supports for Young Carers

Young carers are children and young people under the age of 18 whose lives are in some way affected because they provide care, assistance or support to another family member in the home. Young adult carers are recognised as a separate group and are aged between 18 and 24 years.

Family Carers Ireland provides a variety of supports and services to family carers. Family Carers Ireland also maintains a nationwide network of Carer Groups and is committed to
