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
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#### WEBINARS & TRAINING

'A Vision for the Health and Wellbeing of Children and Young People in Ireland' was published on National Children's Day. This framework document describes a holistic approach for the health and wellbeing needs of children and young people from a population needs perspective underpinned by the vision that All Children and Young People in Ireland will be enabled to live their best, healthiest life'

The framework was developed by the HSE's National Clinical Advisor and Group Lead, Children and Young People, National Clinical Programme for Paediatrics and Neonatology and the National Child Health Public Health Programme and describes how these functions work together. It can also be used as tool to inform integrated and strategic health planning for children and young people of all ages.

The Breaking Barriers Fund aims to support Awardees that tackle discrimination and inequality in the Irish labour market and education system.
